CALL FOR PRESENTATIONS

This is a call for student presentations, panels, and symposia for the 17th Annual Connecticut College Psychology Department Conference that will take place in Bill Hall on April 25th.

The Conference offers the opportunity for students and faculty interested in all areas of psychology to share their latest research, theories, and intervention strategies. The conference will also enable many of us to risk new ideas, to support and encourage each other, and to learn as we also teach. We will celebrate commitment to the field of Psychology as we share and learn from each other.

You can contribute to this process by submitting a proposal. We encourage proposals of all types – including presentations of original research projects and theoretical papers.

To propose a presentation:

Submit a proposal that contains the following information

1. Cover Sheet: Each proposal must contain a cover sheet - including name, box number, title, and a 30-50 word abstract reflecting the content of your presentation. This information will appear in the conference program.
2. Description of Your Presentation: Each proposal must include a 1-2 page description of your presentation - including the title, purpose, brief literature review, and structure of your presentation.

Review and Selection Process:

All proposals will be evaluated by the program committee on the basis of the quality of the proposal. Proposals must be submitted by Wednesday, March, 30, 2005 to **Jennifer Rose, Box 5498**. The program will be announced and you will be notified of acceptance or non-acceptance by Friday, April 15, 2005. Your presentation will then take place on the date of the conference.

PRESENTATION OPTIONS AND FORMATS

1. **INDIVIDUAL PRESENTATION** (15 minutes each) - Presentation of theoretical paper, a research project, clinical case material, etc. Individual papers will be grouped together by the Program Committee around themes.
2. **SYMPOSIUM or PANEL** (90 minutes) - Consists of three or four participants who present various perspectives or approaches to some problem or issue. Symposia are related individual papers. Panels are less structured presentations offering several different perspectives on a single theme.
